Careers Field to Farm fork Cookery Skills

Exploring the farm and careers in the countryside; where food comes from; food preparation and hygiene; learning about healthy eating, and savvy tips on shopping for food are all topics we cover in these sessions. We were thrilled to host a November group from Pebblebrook School through Action4Youth, and together made Speedy Biryani Curry, Posh Eggy Wraps and Flatbreads. For some, it's the first time they've seen the animal and then the associated part of meat, or the first time they've handled a pairing knife. All essential life skills.

Feed the birds

While the hedgerows are abundant, our wild birds still need a helping hand as the frosts draw in. Road Farm is part of the Chilterns Cluster group of farmers committed to improve winter forage for farmland birds. Our Farm Helpers and some of our Countrymen have been spreading seed to supplement their diet.

During cold spells an extra supply of food and fresh water can save the lives of birds. The RSPB advises that bird cake and food bars are very good because of their high-fat content, as are unsalted peanuts. Bird seed mixtures are also high in oils.
