Some find communication very difficult or suffer extreme anxiety, but their confidence can return with animal interaction or skills involvement. Several young men are now very capable of woodturning beautiful items on the lathes, but started here as individuals never trusted at school with a pair of scissors!

Families Enjoy Open Farm Sunday

Over 700 people visited our farm throughout the day to celebrate Open Farm Sunday and to enjoy beautiful Road Farm and the surrounding Chilterns countryside. Many either joined our farmer-led walks which highlighted the different aspects of farming, biodiversity, wildlife or followed our map on a self-guided tour. Sheep dog demonstration, spotting the Queen Bee, woodturning and meeting

the goats sessions were all a marvel. Well done and thank you to everyone who came, helped out and shared the day with us all. "All of it was wonderful. It was great to see a real life farm, which is why we enjoy going to these. We loved learning about everything."

'Inspired to Grow' sees youngsters flourish

Inspired to Grow, based in our polytunnel and orchard area, aimed to build confidence in young people to sustainably grow and then taste diverse, nourishing



plants, and explore connections between soil, biodiversity and fungi.

A group of teenagers participated in 15 workshops covering diverse topics from biodiversity, seasonal planting, exploring mushrooms & alternative protein sources to cooking ingredients, preserving, and planting fruit trees. It was a joy to see the young people excited by growing foods, their confidence boosted, friendships made, practical skills learnt and hobbies developed, all helping on the pathway to independence.
